Library Resources and Services

USC Salkehatchie has two libraries, one located at the West Campus in Allendale and one, the Peden McLeod Library, on the East Campus in Walterboro. Students have access to monographic holdings through the OPAC and WebPac catalogs which list by title, author, subject, and keyword all books and journal titles and holdings. The libraries have periodical journals in paper and microfilm format. They also have access to electronic books, titles listed in catalogs, and an URL link to be able to read the books. Students have access, through various databases, to journal articles, some of these being citations, abstracts, or full-text. Students also have access to needs items that are not owned by our libraries through the interlibrary loan system that can get books to them within a week.

Students have access to between 15 and 20 databases, allowing them admission to over 20,000 journal titles either as citations, abstracts, or as full-text. All databases are updated/upgraded on a regular basis, and the University is ready to add additional databases, as monies become available.

Over the last year, 35,313 patrons visited the libraries; 8438 items were in circulation, and the reference staff dealt with 2200 questions. Forty-five Ebooks were accessed and 10,146 Internet searches were recorded. In addition, library staff presented 25 lectures or tours of the facilities for approximately 466 patrons.

Student surveys are administered once each semester for a two-week period. Results over the last several years have been very satisfactory. The few complaints or suggestions made have concerned noise, atmosphere, and computer access. The University has endeavored to reduce noise from staff and patrons and, to provide a friendlier and more relaxed atmosphere, has created several different types of seating areas. These include casual spaces with area rugs, chairs, sofas, and floor chairs as well as formal study groups of library tables and carrels. We have also established ceiling height directional banners so patrons can easily identify the locations of various sections and materials. We have and are upgrading computers and are adding additional computers dedicated to email or chat mail only. Patrons have also suggested that having access to word processing and the Internet on the same machines would be a benefit for them. The library staff will examine this over the upcoming year. Alumni Surveys

Fifty-seven Alumni Surveys, distributed to members of the 2003 cohort, were mailed to alumni in May 2005. Ten surveys, one incomplete, were returned by June 29, 2005. The results indicate that ninety percent of the respondents are satisfied or very satisfied with their General Education programs and/or requirements and with their overall academic experience. However subsequent questions reveal that they do not continue with their participation in outside "lifelong learning" events once they leave school. Sixty percent or more take part in such activities only annually or less often, even if they do feel that their college experience strongly influenced the participation efforts they do make.

Nearly half of the respondents are unemployed and did not seek employment after graduation, a possible explanation for which might be that 70 percent indicated they are continuing their education on a full-time basis. One hundred percent of the respondents indicated that they felt their experience at USC Salkehatchie adequately to excellently prepared them for employment or continuing education. One hundred percent also reported that the overall quality of their USC Salkehatchie education was average or above average.

The demographics of the respondents to this survey reflected our student body and the counties which we serve: 65 % African American, 25% Caucasian, and 15% Multi-Racial. Additionally, 85% were female and 15% were male. (Please see the results in parenthesis on the next page.)
